

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

Supplementary Figure 1. Female SDQ data.

The plot shows the frequency distribution of the scores in all five SDQ scales and impact and total difficulties scores in the female sample.

On the x-axis there is the score on each scale, whereas on the y-axis, the frequency in percentage. Five scales and impact score range from 0 to 10, contributing to a total difficulties score (0 to 40). Higher scores indicate more serious problems or better prosocial behavior.
